


# A Plane That Brings Love

# Story Discussion Guide

- Understand the emotional and social impact of war on children and families.
- Learn how hope and peaceful thinking can become powerful tools of change.
- Explore how even small voices—like Samer’s—can carry important messages.
- Be encouraged to value peace, cooperation, and nonviolence.

## Lesson plan

Use this story to introduce children to the idea that peace begins with individuals—and even children can be peacebuilders.

## Learning Outcome

### Before Reading:

- What do you think war feels like for children?
- What would you send on a plane if it could deliver peace?

### During Reading :

- How does Samer feel about the planes flying overhead? What does he wish people would do instead of fighting?
- Why do you think he chooses to act with love?

### After Reading-

- What can we learn from Samer’s idea?
- Can children help change the world? How?
- How can you spread peace in your family or classroom?

## Activities:

- **Peace Plane Parade:** Children decorate paper airplanes with drawings and short messages of love, hope, or kindness. These can be suspended around the classroom like a sky of peace messages.
- **Circle of Peace:** Children stand in a circle holding hands. Each child takes a turn sharing one kind or peaceful word. Together, they agree on a classroom 'Peace Pact': 'When there's a disagreement or fight, we will use words of love and try to understand each other.'
- **Peace Posters(Optional):** Provide pre-cut heart or dove shapes for children to glue onto a shared class poster with their names and peaceful messages.

## Expected Outcomes

Children will empathize with those affected by conflict and understand the importance of choosing kindness and peace. They'll be empowered to believe that even small voices matter in building a better world.
